- *Resources adaptable for use in the classroom.*

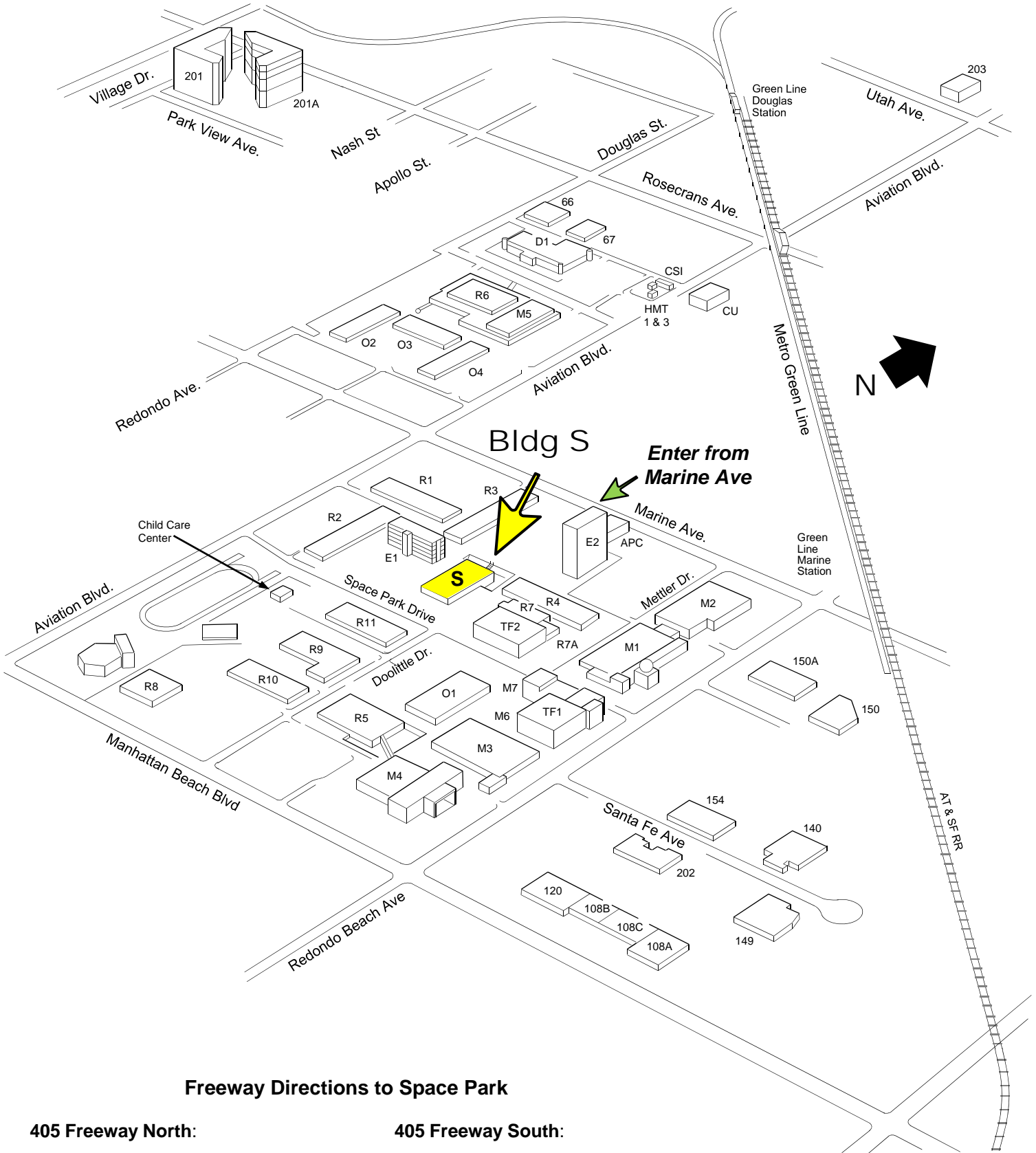
Workshop graduates become Galileo Teacher Ambassadors. Upon completion of this two-day workshop, participants will receive a class set of 9 Galileoscopes.
