

Dr. Adrian Perrig



Dr. Adrian Perrig is the Technical Director of CyLab, Carnegie Mellon University's cyber security laboratory. He is also a Professor in Electrical and Computer Engineering, Engineering and Public Policy, and Computer Science at Carnegie Mellon.

Dr. Perrig earned his Ph.D. degree in Computer Science from Carnegie Mellon University, and spent three years during his Ph.D. degree at the University of California at Berkeley. He received his B.Sc. degree in

Computer Engineering from the Swiss Federal Institute of Technology in Lausanne (EPFL).

Dr. Perrig's research revolves around building secure systems and includes network security, trustworthy computing and security for social networks. More specifically, he is interested in trust establishment, trustworthy code execution in the presence of malware, and how to design secure next-generation networks.
